2 Timothy 1: 1-5

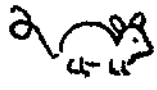
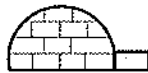

He had become a believer in the Lord Jesus, possibly when Paul first visited his city.

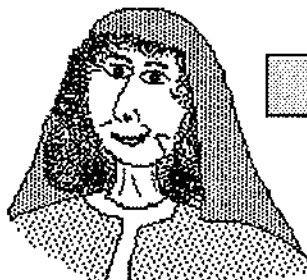

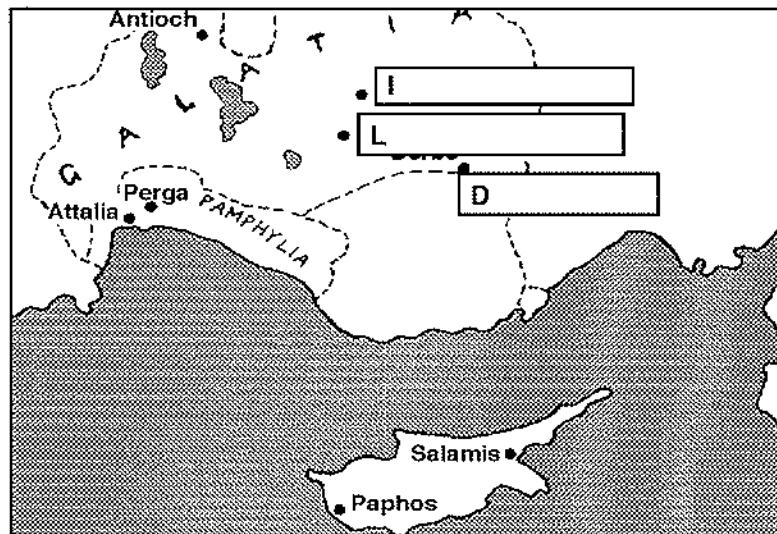
