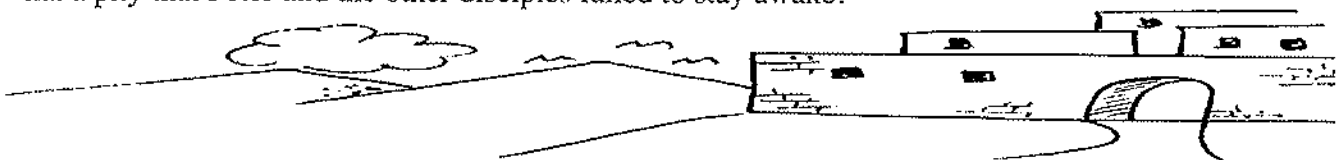

No wonder Peter wept bitterly, as he realized how much he had failed his Lord! Peter had been in the wrong place, among the wrong people and had the wrong purpose in his heart! (See Matthew 26: 58.) As a result, he had fallen into temptation and had sinned by telling lies, swearing (Mark 14: 71) and denying the Lord Jesus.



We, too, must be careful where we go, with whom we mix and how we think. If we are to remain loyal to the Lord Jesus Christ, we must obey the teaching of 1 Peter 1: 13-16.
