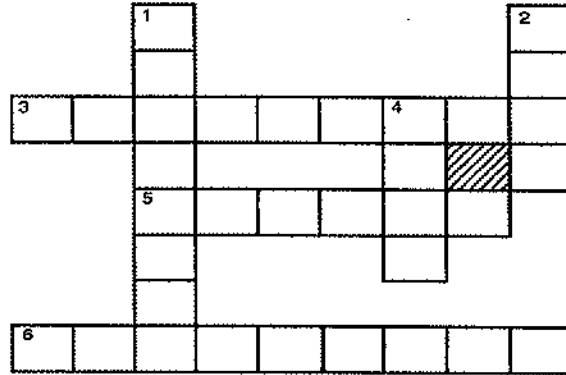
MINI-CROSSWORD

Faith in the name of the Lord Jesus had made the man strong. Peter again made his message personal and challenged each one present to repent and be converted, through turning to God.

The Lord wants to pour out His blessings upon all who turn to Him from their wicked ways. The lame man's deliverance from a lifetime of helplessness naturally produced joy and praise (verse 8).

Similarly, those who have been rescued from their sin should have joy in their hearts, and much praise to God their Lord and Saviour.
