But there is a deeper meaning to the parable, too. The wounded man lying on the roadside is a 'picture' of each of us. He needed someone to rescue him; we too, need to be rescued and saved from our sins.

The **good news** is that the Lord Jesus has come from Heaven to deliver us. He has paid the price necessary to do this, by dying for us at Calvary.
