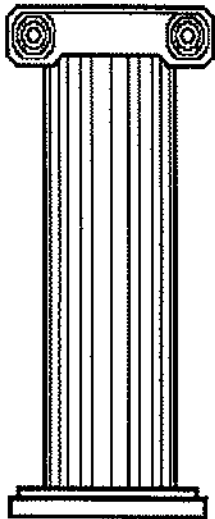
Lesson No. 3 The Adventures of Paul: 'Before the king'

and 26: 13-32*



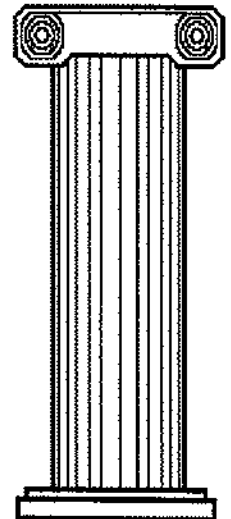
Acts 26: 22



*In Acts 25: 13-22,
Governor Festus tells King Agrippa about the prisoner Paul.
Agrippa then asks to be allowed to hear Paul for himself.*

*In Acts 26: 13-32,
Paul defends himself before King Agrippa.*

Sometimes during holidays you may visit several different relatives. They all seem to want to know how you are getting on at school. 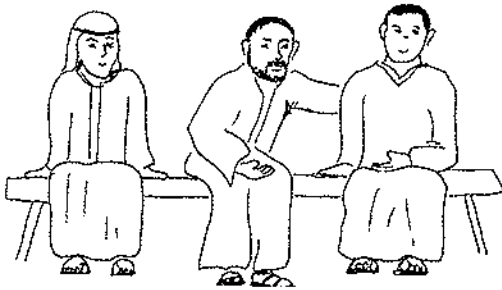

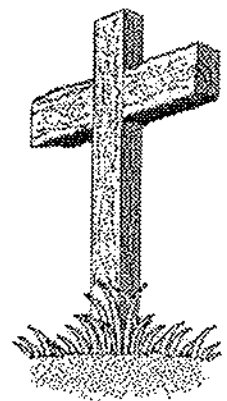
