Lesson No. 4 The Adventures of Paul - City of Athens



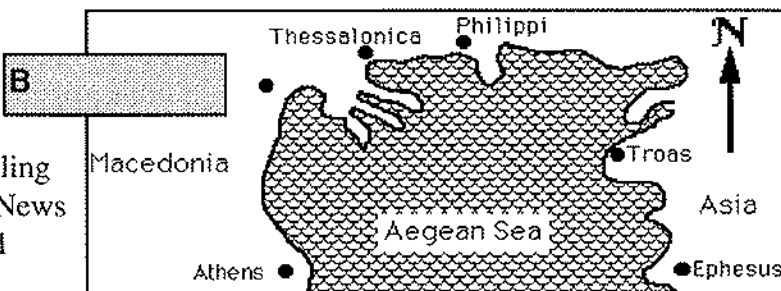
Acts 17: 10-34

Nowadays, people travel quickly and easily for many reasons. Perhaps it's on business, on holiday or to visit friends.

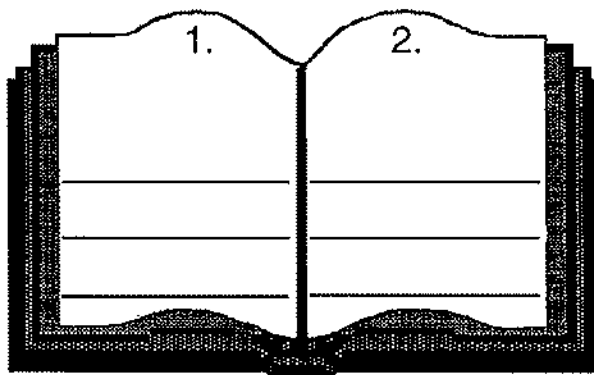
We now find Paul and his companions travelling to other European cities to preach the Good News of Jesus. After leaving Philippi, they visited several cities including Thessalonica.

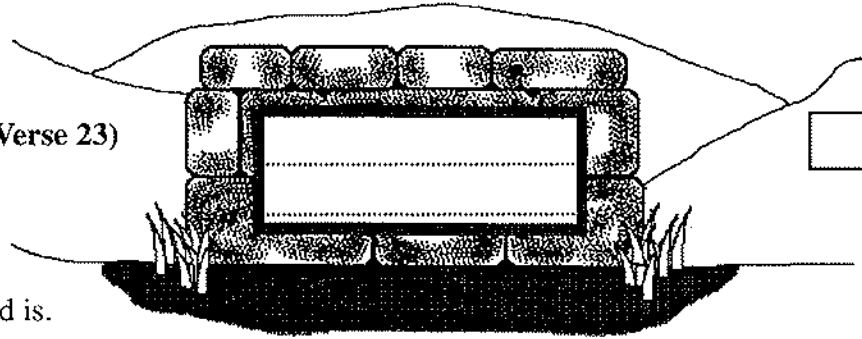
