and 28: 1-9

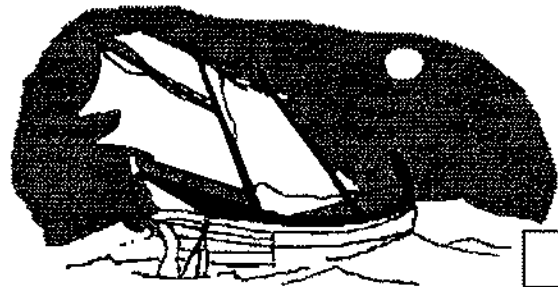


Acts 27: 25
