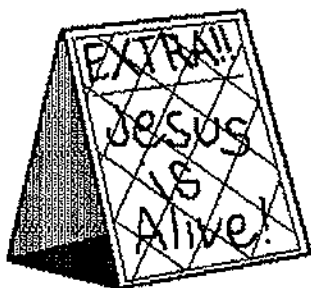
Lesson No. 4 The Adventures of Paul - 'A Divided City'

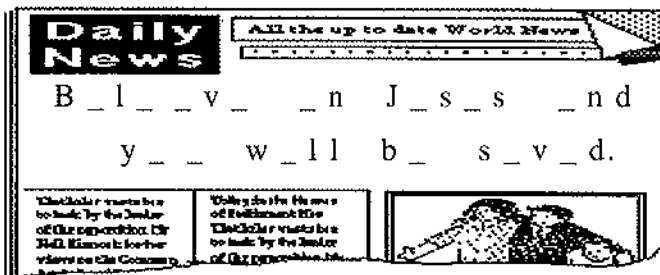

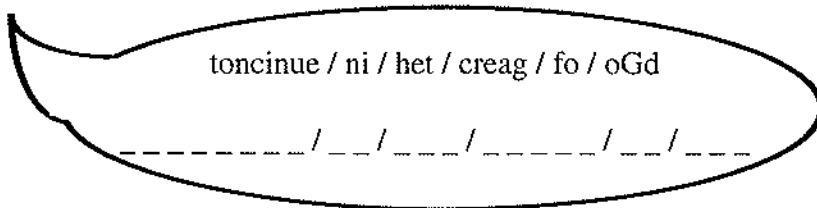

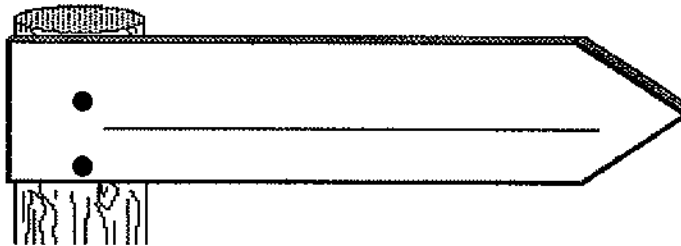
