John 1: 12

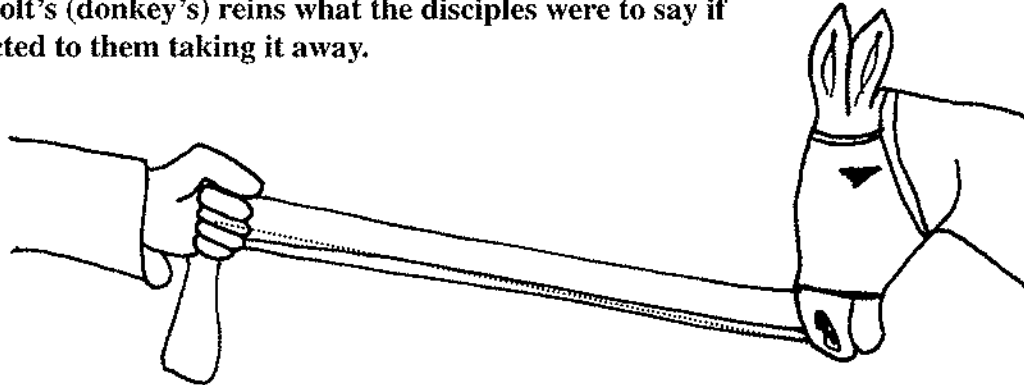
