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
MOST of the Bible Books are divided into chapters and verses.

For example, if you look in the Gospel of Luke *chapter* 1 you will see that it is divided into 80 parts which we call *verses*. With the *chapter* and *verse* it is possible to find any place in the Gospel of Luke very quickly.



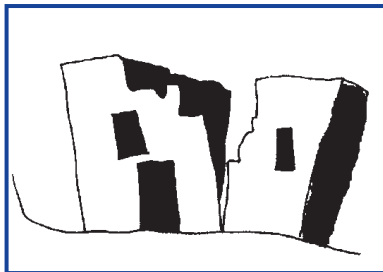
The Lord Jesus speaks to us from the Bible.

We need to read it and make sure we do what it says.

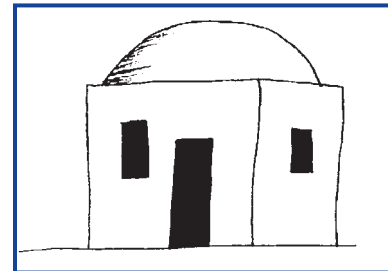

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What happened to the house which had no foundation?

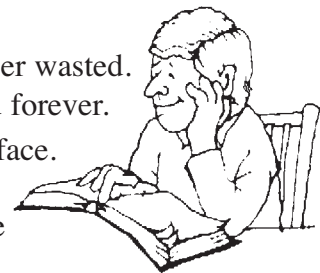
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The man who took time to dig his foundations proved that the time he had invested was well worth while. The other, who hadn't bothered, faced total destruction!
